Good Relations Training Calendar 2011 | 2012

All of the courses below will be co-ordinated by the Good Relations Department at the Armagh City and District Council.

COURSE	INFORMATION ON COURSE	ADULTS / YOUTH	DATE / TIME
OCN Level 3 in Future Leaders Programme	The Future Leaders Project aims to support young people to realize their leadership potential and to develop leadership skills including how to motivate others, build teams and manage team dynamics. During the Project participants will complete an OCN Level 3 accredited course which will involve theory, practical exercises and team activities where the participants will have the opportunity to learn about leadership and demonstrate and develop their own leadership skills and styles. The OCN Level 3 will be delivered over 30 hours and participants will also attend a study visit to London. During the Project participants will be encouraged to identify good relations issues and plan and design a project that will create change in their area of interest. <i>Workshops will be delivered during the day from 10am - 4pm.</i>	Youth [14 – 17]	July - August 2011
Conflicts of Interest	This Pilot project was developed to address the need for different communities to understand the views and opinions of others, in the context of the conflict centred in Northern Ireland. The programme sets out to allow people to build their understanding of and explore the reasons for conflict, and to then explore conflict within a European and Global context. This programme is accredited by Queens University in Belfast. <i>Workshops will be delivered during the day from 10am - 4pm.</i>	Adults	August - Oct 2011
Civic Links Project	The Civic Link Project is a year long project which involves inter group activities, contact and residential sessions between youth groups, partnered on a cross border basis. Partnered youth groups identify and research good relations issues specific to their areas, develop practical policy based solutions and explore how they can take action at public policy level. Each youth group share their information research and work together to explore common problem solving strategies. Through joint community panel presentations at the end of the year, each partnership shares their learning in relation to responsible citizenship and civic engagement, illustrates an understanding of each others identity and community, and how they have developed greater mutual understanding and respect for diversity and human rights. <i>Workshops will be delivered one evening per week from 7pm - 9pm.</i>	Youth [14 – 17]	Sept - Nov 2011
Interaction Project	This 8 week project aims to use theatre as a way of raising awareness of good relations issues. During the programme participants will have the opportunity to attend a number of theatre plays in the Market Place Theatre which will be followed by a number of educational workshops relevant to the issues covered in the plays. The following plays will be central to the project: Exodus Theatre Play - 16th Sept 2011 A night with George - 20th Oct 2011 Both Sides of the Story - 1st Nov 2011 The history of the Troubles according to my Da - 14th Nov 2011 <i>Educational Workshops will be delivered one evening per week from 7pm – 9pm.</i>	Adult	Sept - Nov 2011

Walk in my Shoes Project	This is a 12 week education programme with young people from secondary schools from throughout the Armagh City and District. As part of the project young people will complete an OCN Level 2 in Good Relations & Civic Leadership and also attend a residential to Poland to see at first hand the impact of extreme racism in society. On completion of the 12 week education project the young people will then develop an exhibition and booklet for their peers in school which will reflect their learning during the course of the project. <i>Workshops will be delivered during school hours one day per week.</i>	Youth [14 – 17]	Sept – Dec 2011
PASS Community Leadership Project	The aim of the PASS (Promoting Acceptance in Society through Sport) Community Leadership programme is to "To use sport as a way of tackling social exclusion & influencing community development within the Armagh City and District." The programme will look at such sports as Soccer; Rugby and Gaelic Football with participants getting the opportunity to play and watch each of these sports. Participants will also undertake an accredited "Understanding Diversity in Society" training course which is the equivalent to a GCSE pass. As part of the training programme the young people will be attending a study visit to Glasgow where they will have the opportunity to participate in a number of activities organized by the Old Firm Alliance Project. Such activities include attending a Scottish Premier League Match; participate in a football coaching session with both Celtic & Rangers football coaches; participate in an educational workshop on Racism & sectarianism and attend a stadium tour of Celtic Park / Ibrox. <i>Workshops will be delivered one evening per week from 7pm – 9pm.</i>	Youth [14 – 17]	Jan – March 2012
All Sorts Project	The aim of this project is to provide people with the skills and information to challenge negative stereotypes by providing opportunities to meet and share experiences with others from different backgrounds and cultures. The All Sorts Programme will involve two residential: one in Belfast and one in Poland. <i>Workshops will be delivered one evening per week from 7pm – 9pm.</i>	Adult	Jan – March 2012
OCN Level 2 in Good Relations & Civic Leadership	This Open College Network (OCN) Level 2 accredited training course in Good Relations & Civic Leadership is the equivalent to a GCSE qualification and addresses such issues as Identity, Cultural Diversity and equality. This training is delivered over two days in Belfast (One night residential) and will incorporate an educational tour of the Falls and Shankill Road with Political Ex Prisoners as trained tour guides. This will give participants the opportunity to learn about the British / Irish Conflict and the Peace Process from the guides personal knowledge and experience.	Adult	to be confirmed
Epilogues Training Programme	<i>Epilogues'</i> is an accessible workshop based education programme using a DVD and website to engage people in the everyday work of peace-building and responsible citizenship. It does this by exploring, within a workshop environment that models democratic process, six key themes that are central to an understanding of violent political conflict - Violence, Loss, Revenge, Forgiveness, Justice, & Human Rights. The exploration is deepened through direct engagement with the perspectives of both victims of, and the various parties to, the violent political conflict in and about 'Northern Ireland'. The aims of the programme are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - to give participants both an overview of, and an insight into, the underlying causes of conflict - to help develop a culture of justice and human rights - to better equip citizens to play an active role in peace building The course will be delivered over 3 days in Armagh from 10am - 4pm with the training incorporating a residential to Derry / Londonderry during which people will participate in the Bloody Sunday Tour and the History of Unionism Tour.
